



## Assistant Professor | Tenure-track

The Institute of Mental Health in association with the Department of Psychiatry, Faculty of Medicine at the University of British Columbia invites applications for a full-time, tenure track clinician scientist. The position is expected to be filled at the rank of Assistant Professor.

The successful candidate must either have an M.D. qualification (or equivalent) and be eligible for licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia, or hold a Ph.D. in a related discipline and be eligible for licensure by the College of Psychologists of British Columbia. He/she will provide evidence of ability in teaching and scholarly activity (or the potential to meet this criteria), and must have demonstrated promise as an independent investigator in the domain of Psychotherapy Research. The successful candidate will be expected to work collaboratively with other clinicians and scientists committed to related research. He/she will also be expected to participate in teaching at the undergraduate, graduate or postgraduate level.

The UBC Institute of Mental Health has the mandate to create new knowledge relevant to mental illnesses and to translate this into clinical practice. The position is based primarily on the main UBC campus in Vancouver, a vibrant multicultural city abounding with cultural and recreational opportunities and which The Economist has deemed to be the world's most liveable city for the past five years.
