7. BBVA Foundation – Seeking Nominations

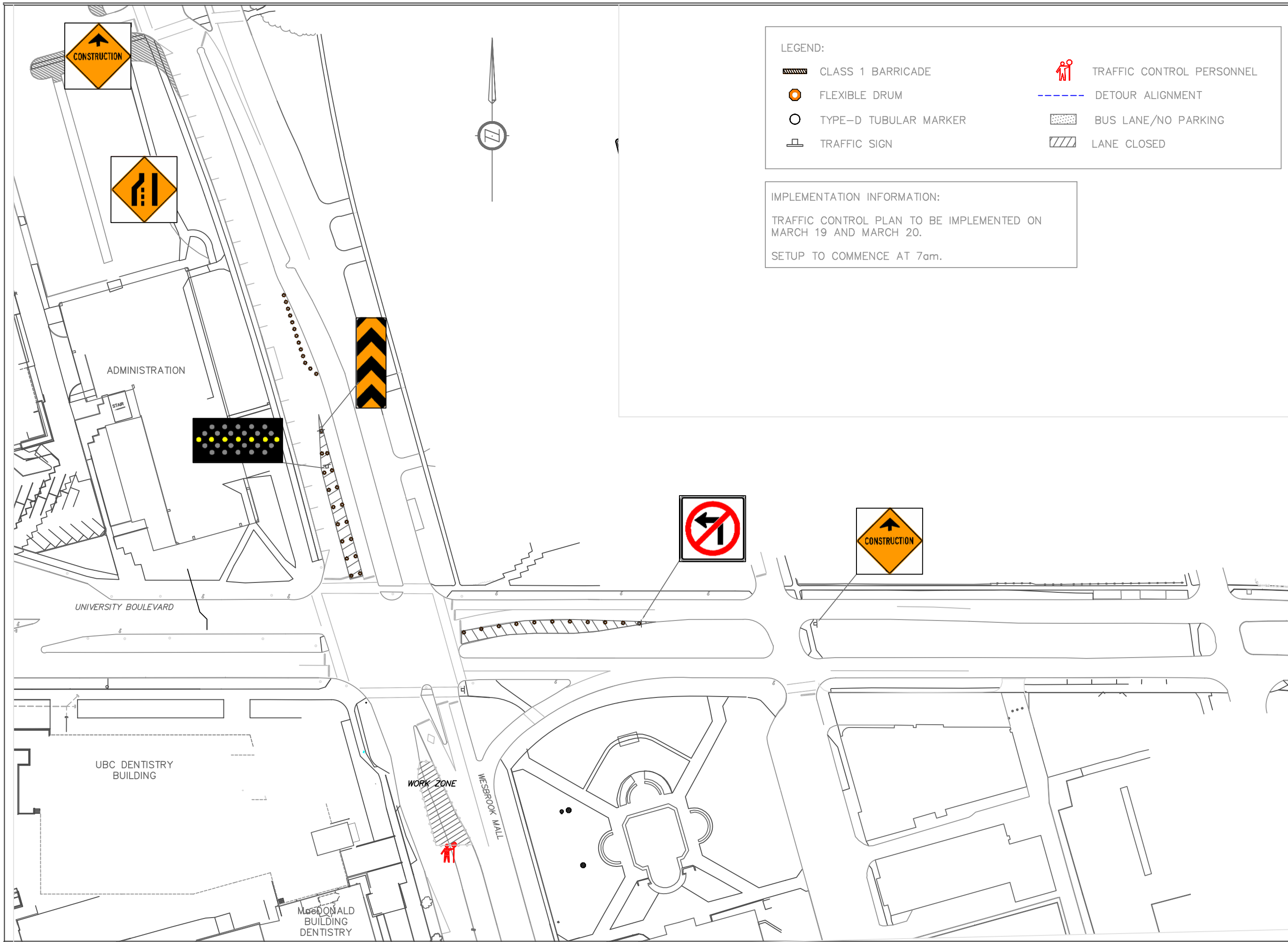

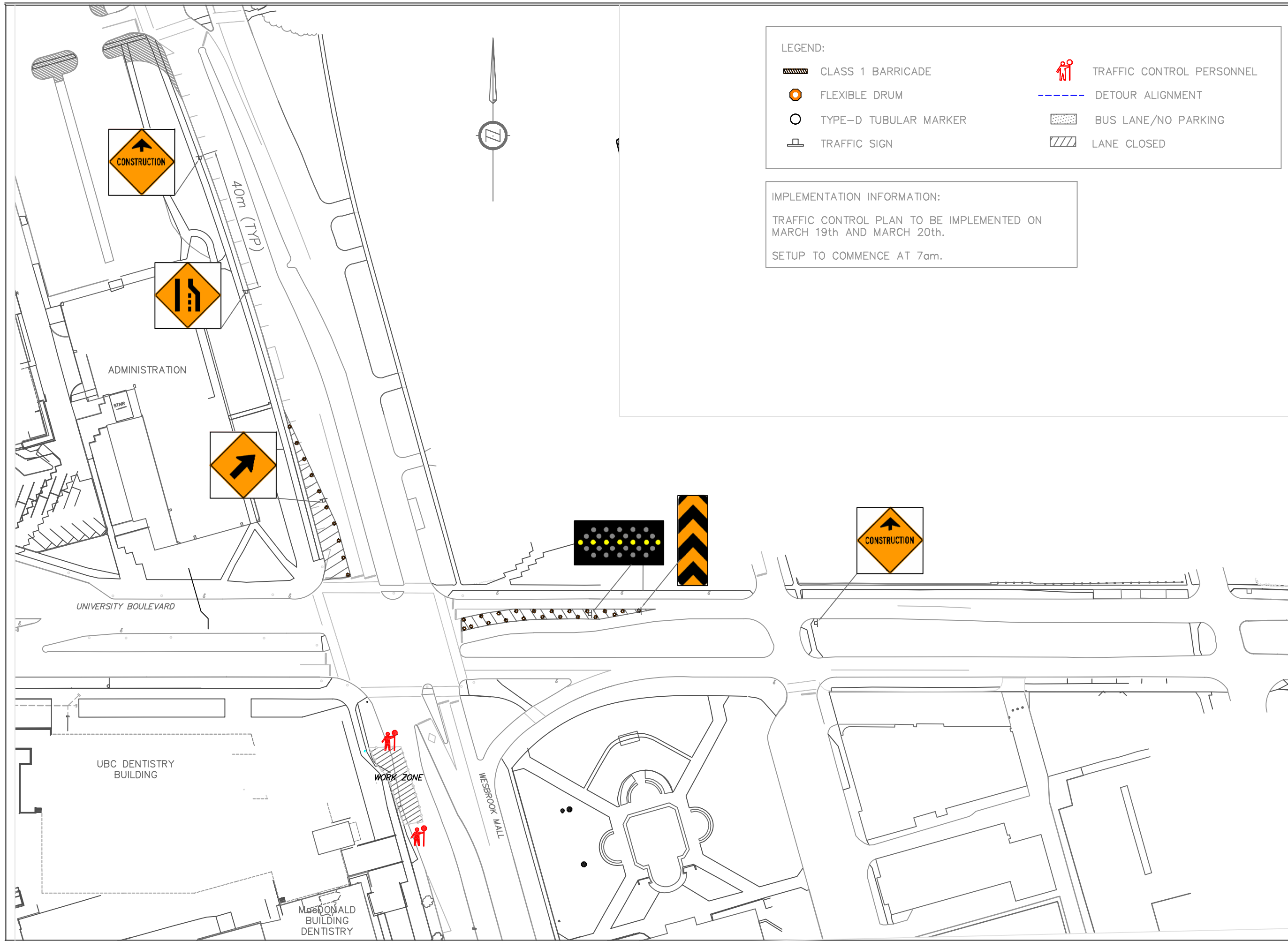
