Dr. Ashok Krishnamoorthy, MBBS, MDDNB, MSc, MRCPsych, FRCPC, DipABAM

Dr. Ashok Krishnamoorthy is a Geriatric psychiatrist with Vancouver Coastal Health, and has been a clinical faculty member in the Department of Psychiatry since 2015. Since 2016, he has served as the Geriatric Subspecialty Program Director for the Department's Postgraduate Education Program. Ashok's interest in serving on the Clinical Faculty Appointment and Promotion Committee stems from his strong belief in the importance of contributions made by all the faculty members in teaching, training and research, which are essential in maintaining a well-functioning training program. Dr. Stephen Wiseman, MD, FRCPC

Dr. Stephen Wiseman graduated from the University of Calgary medical school in 1989 and completed his psychiatric residency at the University of British Columbia in 1996. He has since worked in a variety of settings, including doing inpatient psychiatry and ECT at St. Paul's Hospital, private outpatient practice, and more recently within the context of the Complex Pain program - again at St. Paul's. Stephen is also a founding director of what has been BC's only fully-private, clinical rTMS service, BrainStim Healthcare Associates.
